If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others.

Sunday, October 11, at 10:00, we will celebrate the 203rd Anniversary of Strongsville United Church of Christ with an **In-person Worship Service**. The service will be contemplative in nature. Tom Foley will provide reflective piano music during the service. Here is what you need to know and do if you wish to participate:

- ♥ **The service will be held in Pilgrim Hall.**
- ♥ **Masks are required.** If you do not have a mask, we will have some available.
- ♥ **Temperatures will be taken** before you enter the worship space. (If you are feeling unwell, or if you have an underlying health condition, including age, please stay home, even if you have made a reservation.)
- ♥ **Hand sanitizer** will be available.
- ♥ **Reservations are required!** Attendance will be limited to only **40 guests**, in family groups as arranged in advance. Please call the office by **Noon on Friday, October 9th** if you are interested.

Entry into the building will be through the parking lot doors; exit will be through the north door of Pilgrim Hall. **The doors will open at 9:55.** After the service, folks are invited to exit Pilgrim Hall and continue their fellowship in the parking lot.
