#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In just a few days, Holy Week will begin. Holy Week is the most sacred time of the year for Christians. During Holy Week we celebrate the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. We then gather together on Good Friday to remember the crucifixion of our Lord. Finally on Easter morning we all come together to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.

When I began my ministry, I was greatly surprised to find that many of us did not know about what happened on Holy Thursday and Good Friday. I was amazed that so many Christians appeared in church on Easter dressed in their finest spring outfits to celebrate Jesus' being resurrected from the dead without knowing what He went through and how important the resurrection is. It seemed to me that many didn't have a clue of what Jesus went through or why he did it in order to get to Easter Sunday. This lack of understanding was further brought home to me when on one Sunday in Lent early in my ministry, a couple church members came to me disturbed that I was wearing a crucifix. "Why do you wear that cross with Jesus hanging on it? We are not Catholic, and we have an empty cross." Somehow many of us had missed the point that you can't get to the empty cross without going to the one with Jesus on it first.

Then it came to me that we don't want to think about the death of our Lord on a cross. We want to turn our faces away when we think of seeing the horror that must have happened when He was nailed to the cross and lifted high in the air and left to die. It makes us uncomfortable to think of the pain and suffering that he must have endured. However, what he endured on the cross is the exact reason why we must not turn our eyes away. It is because he suffered so much on the cross that we can understand what he gave for us. It was exactly his suffering that makes the resurrection so glorious.


When we experience his suffering and death, the celebration of his resurrection becomes even more exciting; for we are assured that we too will be able to overcome death and suffering and receive the kingdom of heaven. For those of us who walk the journey from Holy Thursday through Good Friday, Easter becomes the grandest celebration of the year. It's a time to have balloons and festive foods—a time to sing *Christ the Lord has Risen Today* and really feel the glorious thing God has done for us. On Easter I can sing *I serve a risen Savior, He's in the world today* and REALLY MEAN IT. I hope you will journey with the Lord this Holy Week and celebrate Jesus with me on Easter morning.
