People: Help us remember that the dawn always banishes the darkness. [silence]

Leader: As we light this second candle, the Candle of Love, we remember those whom we have loved and lost. We pause and remember their names, their faces, their voices, the memories that bind our hearts to theirs, and give thanks for their presence in our lives.

People: May the eternal love of the Almighty surround them and comfort US.

Leader: We light the third candle, the Candle of **Promise**, to redeem the pain of broken promises: relationships that failed, health that diminishes, fears for an uncertain future. We pause to gather up the pain of the past and offer it to God. We rest in the faithfulness of God's promises. People: Renew us, O Lord. Restore us, refresh us and lead us forward

into your future.

Leader: The fourth candle, the Candle of Peace, we light as a reminder of the faithfulness of the Holy One, who came as an ordinary child, born in the usual way, raised in a loving home. We remember that God-in-flesh experienced pain, knew deep suffering and loss; yet he promises us a peace that will pass all understanding.

People: Today, we pray for that peace to fill our hearts.
