## Mendle Adams, vitae

Rev. Dr. Mendle Adams is an ordained minister of the United Church of Christ. His undergraduate degree is from Indiana Wesleyan University; his seminary degree is from Christian Theological Seminary. He has done post graduate studies at Aquinas College and Harvard University. He received his doctorate of sacred letters from Temple Bible College & Seminary of Cincinnati, Ohio.

Reverend Adams has pastored churches in Indiana, North Dakota, Kansas, Oklahoma, Kentucky and Ohio. While serving as Ecumenical Campus Minister at Oklahoma State University, Professor Adams received training and certification from the Supreme Court of Oklahoma for training of Mediators for the Oklahoma Justice System. His ministries have included travels to Palestine/Israel, The Philippines, Nicaragua, and the Ukraine. He is a published co-author of a confirmation/pastors class text book, Touching Center: Adventures in Christ Consciousness.

In 1975, Mendle received the Indiana Council of Churches Honored Legislator recognition while serving in Indiana's House of Representatives. Mendle has been a leader in civil rights, equal rights, death penalty abolition, and other progressive causes over the years.

While in Cincinnati, Mendle was an adjunct professor at Cincinnati State Technical & Community College, and moderator of an interfaith dialogue "Religion Beyond Dogma" at the Blue Ash campus of the University of Cincinnati.

He taught "Practical Ministry" at the United Church of Christ and Presbyterian Church's School for Lay Ministers in 2012.

Dr. Adams now resides in Richmond Heights, Ohio, with his daughter, Vicki Werneke, and her husband, Ron.

After 50 years in the ministry, upon retirement in 2007, he taught at Temple Bible College & Seminary.

Mendle is a member of ACLU, SLPC, and the Masonic Lodge. He is a member Plymouth Church of Shaker Heights, and the board of directors of Ohioans to Stop Executions.

His interests include Interfaith Dialogue, Evolution and Religion, and Human Rights.

WELK WALK CROP HUNGER WALK As you take each step in the CROP Hunger Walk, imagine that you're in Kenya, walking to get water that you'll carry back home in a 5-gallon can balanced on your head. Your family needs this water for drinking, bathing, preparing meals or watering the garden or livestock. Whatever the reason, 5 gallons of water weighs about 42 pounds, and you may have
