HEADLINE NEWS

Charges Brought Against Church Member

The life of the congregation during the late 1820's and 1830's spent the greater part of their collective energies upon moral correctness. It was typical of the time period that members would stand and express their personal sins to the congregation. One case, in May 1839, was brought against John Fuller. The first charge was that he belonged to a secret society not consistent with the gospel. Secondly, that he had gone to Canada to aid in an insurrectionary movement. Thirdly, that he had transferred rifles belonging to the United States government to Canada to aid the movement. The fourth charge was that he was seen at a late hour at a tavern with improper persons at a New Year's Ball. And finally, that he had violated his temperance pledge. The incident occupied much of the year and could not be settled by the church. A 'mutual council' of other churches was held before the matter could be resolved.

OHIO CONFERENCE OUTDOOR MINISTRY UPDATE ON PILGRIM AND TEMPLED HILLS

Back in November, I reported about the Ohio Conference Board of Directors' plan to keep both Pilgrim and Templed Hills open, and to use both camps for the upcoming camp season. The Board met in December, and, probably to no one's surprise, that plan has changed once again.

The loss of OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission) support has decreased severely in the last two years and shows no sign of reversal. The Board, even with the expertise of the UCCR, has decided to go with an earlier proposal to use only one camp site. This is in direct contrast with the Treasurer's report from November that reported a plan to maintain and use both camps after turning a modest profit last year. A second task force has been formed that will review both Templed Hills and Pilgrim Hills and make a recommendation in February as to which camp site is more feasible for the Conference to maintain.

So while it appears that our church will be able to continue having our All-Family Winter Retreat at one of the camps we've used in the past, at this point we don't know which location that will be in 2018. We most certainly will not have our choice of camps either.

I will continue to keep the congregation and Retreat goers updated as news is reported to me.
