FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Here is what's happening with that project: The Board of Trustees has hired architect Ibrahim Hakki to submit drawings of the reconfigured area, which includes relocating and/or removing some of the doors in that hallway. Once the drawings are presented to the City of Strongsville and State of Ohio and approved, a contractor will be hired to complete the work. As simple as this project may appear, in reality it is quite complex with a lot of regulations that must be followed. This process takes time, but we are moving forward on it.
