FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The space in which we live should be for the person we are becoming now, not for the person we were in the past. --Marie Kondo

Marie Kondo has become a household name. People turn to her for help de-cluttering their homes and their lives. Seems to me, society as a whole could benefit from the Kondo touch.

Kondo's basic principle goes something like this: As you go through your clutter, hold each item in your hand. If it no longer sparks joy, get rid of it.

What if we were to take this approach with our ways of thinking? (Even our ways of thinking about God?) What if we paused to reflect on some of those cherished beliefs we may have held since childhood and asked ourselves: Does this still "fit" the person I'm becoming? Have I "outgrown" this way of thinking or believing?

Changing the way we think can be very, very hard—and very, very necessary. When was the last time you stepped back and asked yourself why you believe what you believe (and not just about God)? Perhaps you were brought up believing certain things based on a person's age, or gender, or race, or even the neighborhood they lived in or the school they attended, but later came to realize these things simply weren't true.

This pandemic has left us with extra time for selfreflection. Maybe it's time to take a closer look at ourselves and de-clutter our beliefs a bit. Hold those beliefs up to the light in prayer and examine them more closely. Are they true, or simply comfortable, or convenient?

Take time to reflect on whether these beliefs are helpful or hurtful. If they've lost their sparkle, you know what you need to do. *Get rid of them!*

OUR CHURCH IN THE COMMUNITY

The Strongsville City Schools had the first of seven weeks of participating in a USDA free produce distribution on June 17th. When the person in charge started, he signed up for 100 22-lb boxes of produce, to match the number of free/ reduced lunch students they were serving for the summer. Well, the number went up . . . and up . . . and they had about 600 boxes of food available. Over 500 were distributed; the rest found homes through agencies such as Church Street Ministries. Shout-out to Clay Williams, Linda Dettmer, Rosie Remle, Cathy Hawk and Chuck & Pastor Heidi for helping out. Food scarcity is a very real thing, even in Strongsville, Ohio. Please keep these families in your prayers.

FROM THE STRONGSVILLE POST:

STRONGSVILLE – Local families have an opportunity to get free fresh produce this summer, thanks to the Farms to Families Food Box Program through the United States Department of Agriculture.

The USDA has partnered with farmers, ranchers, food processors, distributors and non-profit organizations to provide access to fresh fruit and vegetables during the COVID-19 pandemic. It's a mutually beneficial program that alleviates waste and puts quality food on the table for American families.

The program has been brought to Strongsville, and families with students in the school district can take advantage of it at no cost to the individuals or to the Strongsville City Schools.

The program started June 17, and will continue once per week at Strongsville Middle School. Members of the school community go through a drivethrough format around the building and are provided with 22-pound boxes of produce.

In the first distribution alone, 14,080 pounds of produce was handed out. Strongsville schools' Chef Mike Nowosielski, who facilitated the initiative, said the district is on track to distribute 98,560 pounds of food by the end of July. The food comes from the farmers, who sell food that was destined for restaurants and bulk purchasers to distributors. The distributors partner with the USDA to package family-sized boxes with fresh produce, and then they transport them to non-profits across the country. Then the families can pick up the boxes for their personal use.

Volunteers from the Kiwanis Club, the United Church of Christ, the SCS food service department, the SCS custodial department and the district's preferred produce distributer, Premier Produce, were all involved in the success of the initial distribution day for the Strongsville community.

The produce boxes are in addition to free meals that have been provided to students who needed them during the school closure since mid-March.
