UPDATE ON PASTOR BECKY

On Wednesday morning, May 20, Pastor Becky had a heart attack in Amsterdam. The clot in the heart was removed by cardiac catheterization, and a stent was implanted.

On Saturday morning, May 23, Pastor Becky had a cardiogram. Everything looked fine, and she was released from the hospital to go to her hotel room. Pastor Becky had long goodbyes with all the hospital staff that helped her—they were all very friendly and helpful.

The doctors do not want Pastor Becky to fly until June 3, so she and Jack will fly back on June 3. Their return flight is to Washington, D.C.; and Jack will drive them home. Then Pastor Becky will have another week or two to get back to full speed.

Hospital staff recommended that Pastor Becky and Jack spend their remaining time in Amsterdam seeing the sights, which is what they are doing—as of the printing of this newsletter.

Pastor Becky continues to call the church office daily to "check in." She sounds great and is in good spirits. She and Jack extend their appreciation to everyone for their thoughts, concerns, and prayers.

Regarding Pastor Becky's niece Denise and her pregnancy, the doctors are concerned about the neurological development of the fetus. In addition, we are mindful of Erhardt's recent back surgery and that he is still recuperating.

The ACCOUNTS listed on the left side of the page identify where you wanted the money placed, e.g., Pledge / Offerings – Ministries/Operations and the column AMT. GIVEN gives the dollar amount given. If you have pledged for 2015, the PLEDGED, AMT./FREQ., FREQ and OVER/UNDER columns are also filled in. If you see a negative number in the OVER/UNDER column do not worry! It's looking at the whole year of 2015 and sees you UNDER the total amount pledged. You'll need to calculate if you are really under at this time. If you wish assistance or have any questions or concerns on your statement, please contact me.

If you need an alternative way to give to the church, you may want to consider dropping off your offering / donation during the week at the church office, sending it through the U.S. Mail, or setting up ONLINE Banking with your bank. The bank will send a payment (one time or ongoing) directly to the church. Request the check be made out to Strongsville United Church of Christ and mailed to 13740 Pearl Road, Strongsville, OH 44136, phone number 440-238-6697. Also note your envelope number, if possible, and how to direct the giving if it is not all going to Ministries and Operations (MO), e.g., \$10 MO, \$10 OCWM. If there are no instructions on the check, the total amount will be directed to Ministries and Operations.
