FROM THE PASTOR'S GARDEN

Spring has finally arrived. The days are growing longer, and the weather seems to be getting a bit warmer. As I go from place to place, I enjoy looking at all the flowers that are beginning to bloom. I especially like peonies. Having grown peonies for a long time, I can't help but see many similarities between their growth process and our church's growth process.

Peonies are a hearty plant that, once established, can withstand some of the worst weather conditions. They can take the cold of the Ohio winters being blanketed with snow for long periods of time. They don't need a lot of water to live during the heat of the summers either. Peonies are also plants that grow and spread from the root system. Over the years peonies will spread and quadruple in size with not much effort on our part. Peonies also have a life cycle that involves new and more flowers that sprout from the ground each spring, bloom with glorious flowers for a short time, then simply remain green for the remainder of the season

Peonies have large buds that appear at the end of a single stem. Unlike roses or others that have multiple buds, peonies only have a small number and bloom only once a year. One of the things people don't enjoy about this flower is the ants that accompany the plant. Inexperienced gardeners often make the mistake of trying to rid the plant of these ants. However, the plants and the ants have a symbiotic relationship. When the bud has grown to size and is ready to bloom, the ants come and eat a sticky substance that coats each bud. When the substance is gone, the flower can bloom. Without the ants, the peonies cannot produce their beautiful blossoms.

We in the church have many similarities with the peonies. First we grow from our roots. We have historical roots reaching back 200 years and we have continued to build on those roots.

Peonies when planted are bulbs. These bulbs are hardy and are often planted just before the winter frost where they lay dormant until the spring. We also tend to come to church when we are not at our most beautiful form—like bulbs—in search of a new place to plant ourselves and our families.

Great care must be taken when planting peonies. If you plant the bulbs too shallow, the animals will come and eat them. If you plant them too deep, they will grow, but will not produce blooms. Peonies must be planted just right. Also peonies usually don't produce blooms until the second summer after planting. They need time to establish themselves. We are the same in the church. Peonies will bloom for many years; but like us, they have a lifespan and will succumb to disease or time and will finally die. But when they live, they make the most glorious blooms.

As I look around the church, I see beautiful peonies. There are some that are blossoming every year with outstanding beauty. There are some who are growing, but not ready to bloom just yet. There are some who were planted incorrectly and will never bloom, and there are others who are beginning to show struggles with life. My frustration with my peony garden is getting them all to bloom at the same time.

Maybe we need some more ants among us who will gnaw at the stickiness of our lives and help us to bloom.

What a beautiful garden God has given us!
