JUST HOW VALUABLE IS U.S. FOOD AID?

Have you ever wondered what happens to the money we give to help the hungry and poor in the world, through both federal tax dollars earmarked for international development and similar church-related programs? An article in a recent Bread for the World brochure throws light on the question. The agency is a collective Christian voice urging our nation's decision-makers to end hunger at home and abroad.

The devastations wrought by major international disasters in recent years, such as last year's typhoon in the Philippines, 2010's massive earthquake in Haiti, and the on-going crisis in Syria, shows how valuable U.S. food aid is in addressing humanitarian emergencies around the world. Our church has responded to each of these through special offerings and One Great Hour of Sharing, as has our government.

The response to these disasters is usually immediate. In the case of the Philippines, the U.S. Agency for International Development committed \$10 million to the World Food Program to be used to purchase food there. 50 tons of nutritious emergency food was rapidly airlifted from the United States. 100 tons of rice, stored in Sri Lanka just for an emergency, arrived within a month after the disaster. It would have taken 3 months, otherwise. Recently a member of our Mission and Outreach Committee heard an Area Executive of Global Missions give an eye-witness account of his visit to that devastated country and the aid which came from Church World Service and other U.S. religious relief agencies, amounting to millions of dollars.

For more than 30 years, U.S. food aid has been an effective response to humanitarian crises caused by conflict, famine, and natural disasters. Food aid has benefitted more than 3 billion hungry and malnourished people in more than 130 countries over the years.

Today our country is the largest provider of food aid, and we are needed now more than ever. U.S. food aid has played a significant role in preventing hunger and starvation.

STRIVE for 5 (Royalton Road Property) – If possible, **please write a separate check or give cash for your donation.** It can be placed in your regular giving envelope with a note on the outside of the envelope, *Strive for 5*, so that the donation is recorded correctly.

YOUR GIVING – Contributions may be in the form of cash, check, or through your bank. This is something you set up directly with your bank, directing your payment to the church. Request the check be made out to Strongsville United Church of Christ and mailed to 13740 Pearl Road, Strongsville, OH 44136, phone number 440-238-6697. Also note your envelope number and how to direct the giving, e.g., \$10 operations and \$10 OCWM. If there are no instructions, the total amount will be directed to ministries and operations. Each person's giving pledge is not looked up before the donation is posted.

YOUR GIVING ENVELOPES – The church envelopes have a box for designating the direction of your giving - Ministries and Operations and / or OCWM. Your notations on the envelope directs how the giving should be recorded. If there is no entry, the full amount goes under Ministries and Operations. If you are concerned about showing any dollar figures on the envelope, at least show what should be directed to OCWM. Then the balance will go to Ministries and Operations. If there are no notations, it will be recorded as Ministries and Operations.

The MVP of the weekend was Sarah Herzog, who was the grand-prize winner in 4 separate activities.


