

In June 2015 [June 26-30], thousands from across the country (and abroad) will gather for General Synod 30 in Cleveland, Ohio — the birthplace of the United Church of Christ. Together, we will discern resolutions of witness, church structure, and function. We will stand up for issues that demand a faithful witness. And we will join together in worship each day to lift up the Still Speaking God. At General Synod 30, we will explore some of the "Unexpected Places" where we hear God's voice, encounter the Spirit, and find the United Church of Christ lifting up its witness in the world.

The Mission and Outreach Committee is looking for volunteers to help at General Synod! The registration fee for a volunteer is \$60. The General Synod brochure states, "We realize that asking people to 'pay' to volunteer may sound unreasonable, but it is a wonderful way to support the United Church of Christ in its endeavor to bring all of us together as one in faith, service, fellowship, and prayer." The M&O Committee will pay for half of any volunteers' registration fee, so you need only pay \$30, not \$60. We will provide funds for 5 volunteers.
