FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This past weekend I had the pleasure of attending the family retreat at Pilgrim Hills. There were 60 of us who gathered together for a weekend of fellowship and fun. During the weekend I witnessed the changes that seem to be happening among us. This weekend, unlike others in the past, there seemed to be an increasing number of very young children. I saw that some of the people who were once the children of the church returned to the retreat with families of their own. The presence of a growing number of very young children has renewed my belief that the church is going to continue for many years.

Camping ministry has long been part of our church's experience. Growing up, I often attended church camp; and when my children became old enough, I sent them to camp for a couple weeks each summer. At first they seemed unwilling to go to camp. They pouted and cried at being left at the camp; but when I came to pick them up at the end of camp, they didn't want to come home. Something special happened there.

When I was a young pastor I would volunteer to be the director of the entire camp for several weeks each summer. I would invite (sometimes coerce) other adults to volunteer as counselors for the weeks I was the director. On every occasion those counselors had such a moving experience that it became a spiritual high mark of their lives. Even today many reminisce about their camp days. I also know that many children first found their way to God in the camp setting. Also, almost all the pastors will tell you that going to camp helped lead them into pastoral ministry. The camping experience was and is a key factor in our faith development.

This year we will be increasing our participation with the church camp. Not only will we have the Family Camp, but will also host a Men's Retreat weekend, Women's Retreat weekend, Couples Retreat weekend, and hopefully a Youth Retreat weekend. I believe we will see the continued development of Christ's disciples among those who participate in in these weekends.


