Alpha and Omega

My bedtime reading these days is the latest book by Neil deGrasse Tyson, **To Infinity and Beyond** (Washington, D.C.: Curved Light Productions, 2023). It's fascinating, and mind-bending—and staggeringly overwhelming at times. To even imagine *billions* and *trillions* of *anything* is beyond me. Imagining those big numbers *in ways we will never experience?* Whoa.

What I was not expecting from this world-class astrophysicist was the approachability of his storytelling, and his humility. Many smart people *know* how smart they are—and they want *you* to know it, too. Humility is not their strong suit.

But Neil deGrasse Tyson has a story to tell, and he wants it to be understood. One moment, he's blowing my mind; the next, I am giggling off to sleep.

I also was not expecting his comfort with the unknown and the unknowable. Scientists have been asking questions since the beginning; with each generation, more answers can be extrapolated, and many seem convinced that soon, they will find The Answer. But where it all started? Where it will all end? We do not know. We *cannot* know.

That, friends, is where faith makes its home: nestled in between the questions we ask and the answers that seem to dart and weave and stymie our curiosity until, like petulant four-year-olds, we throw up our hands in frustration and stomp off.

And in that space, God who was there at the beginning and remains with us until the end—until infinity and beyond—smiles. God draws us in, comforts us and reassures us that we can never fully know. And that's okay.

As spring returns to this part of the planet, find time to embrace the world around you. Sit and listen for renewed life. *Know* and *trust* and *believe* that God is in each moment. Amen.


