FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Sacred Spaces

Brother Lawrence was a Roman Catholic friar who lived in a monastery in Paris. He was tasked with the most menial labors, in the most dismal parts of the monastery, doing things like washing dishes and peeling potatoes. But with each stroke of the peeler, in the scrubbing and scraping of food from plates, he saw these tasks as opportunities to draw closer to God. In the dark, dismal kitchen, God never failed to show up.

It was the same for Henri Nouwen, who spent time at the Abbey of the Genesee in New York, living and working among the monks. The abbey makes delicious wine to support itself. Nouwen would stand alongside the brothers in silence, sorting the grapes, removing them from their stems and sending them through the washing basin. In the silence, God met him and soothed his troubled heart.

Our church has sacred spaces, as well, places where God is waiting, inviting us to slow down, open our eyes and *truly* see. The sanctuary is an obvious place. But on Communion Sundays, the sacristy—that small room next to the ADA bathroom—becomes a haven for God's Spirit. As the deacons unpack the silver trays and begin to prepare the elements, carefully filling each tiny cup with grape juice and cutting bread cubes, this ordinary room becomes sacred space. What might look to an outsider like just another storage closet is, in reality, one of those unlikely places where God's Presence feels *even more* pronounced. Carl Jung and others referred to them as *liminal spaces*, places where the curtain between this world and the next grows so thin it nearly disappears. For these ordinary women tasked with preparing the Lord's Supper, this space is anything but ordinary. It is a testament to God's Presence in this place.

Where have you experienced a liminal space, a time when the veil nearly disappears and takes your breath away? Your space may not be my space; God surprises us by showing up where and when we least expect it. Thanks be to God!





WELCOME NEW MEMBERS!

Seven new members were welcomed into our church family on February 22, 2026





Rachel Zielinski organized Valentine cookie decorating on February 14th, and everybody was having so much fun, we skipped going out on a field trip this year.
