Pastor: On the Christian Calendar, today is officially Christ the King Sunday, the very last Sunday before we start over again. In this church, today is a bit like a preparation for the preparation, a time to get ready for Advent, the season of waiting. And just as we decorate our homes in anticipation of the arrival of Christmas, so, too, do we decorate God's house with special decorations that remind us of God's faithful presence in our lives and God's never-ending grace.

HOLLY AND IVY

Reading from Isaiah 53:3a, 4a, 5-6

Reader: He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity; Surely He has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases. But He was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; Upon Him was the punishment that made us whole. And by His bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

Pastor: For Christians, this passage from Isaiah reflects the sufferings of Jesus, who redeemed us eternally in victory over death, even death on the cross. In ancient times, holly and ivy were considered signs of Christ's passion. Their prickly leaves suggest the crown of thorns, the red berries the blood of the Savior, and the bitter bark the drink offered to Jesus on the cross. As we place the holly and ivy, let us rejoice in the coming of Jesus our Savior.

WREATH

Reading from Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

Reader: The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in the land of the shadow of death, among them a light has shined. For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given. And the government shall be upon His shoulder, and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Pastor: From ancient times, evergreens have been considered a symbol of eternity, a sign of God's everlasting nature. Isaiah tells us that there will be no end to the reign of the Messiah. Therefore, we hang wreaths shaped in never-ending circles with no beginning and no end, and place garlands of green as signs of everlasting life. These are symbols of Christ's gift of eternal life and of the celebration of Christmas itself.

POINSETTIA

Reading from Isaiah 11:1-2

Reader: A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.

Pastor: There is a beautiful legend told in Mexico that goes something like this: A young girl was sad on Christmas Eve because she had no gift for the Christ Child when she went to chapel. She didn't want to arrive empty-handed, so as she walked, she picked a small bouquet of flowering weeds, hoping the babe would accept her offering. The other children teased her unmercifully, and as she walked, tears began to well up in her eyes. Then-- a miracle happened! As the tears fell from her eyes and landed on the flowers, the weed bouquet she carried turned a glorious red, more beautiful than any flowers ever seen! These fiery flowers today remind us of the Bethlehem star that showed the way to the manger.

PARAMENTS

Reading from Isaiah 40:3-5

Reader: In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill made low. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed.

Pastor: For many weeks now, we have been in what's called "ordinary time" on the church calendar. The green of the paraments, or altar cloths, symbolizes a time of growth. Truly, there has been nothing ordinary about these days! Now, as we approach Advent, the colors on the altar will change. In celebration of Jesus' royal lineage, both human and divine, we offer these purple paraments now, place them as a gift before the Lord and ask God's blessing upon them and us in the weeks ahead.

EVERGREEN TREE

Reading from Micah 5:2, 4

Reader: But you, O Bethlehem, from you shall come forth one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from ancient days. And He shall stand and feed His flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord His God. And they shall live secure, for now He shall be great to the ends of the earth; and He shall be the one of peace.

Pastor: In ancient times the cedar was revered as the tree of royalty. It also signified immortality and the eternal nature of God. Today, we prefer other varieties of evergreen, but the meaning remains unchanged. We place this tree in our sanctuary as a symbol of Christ, who reigns as King forever, and whose coming will purify our hearts.

Pastor: From the time we are little children, we have been taught that Jesus is the Light of the World. Even in the most dismal of days, the Light of Life cannot be extinguished. As we draw nearer to Advent, waiting in hope, let the candles and lights on our trees remind us of the One who brings light into our darkness, healing to our broken places, and peace to all who receive Him. May this tree, arrayed in beauty and splendor, remind us, as well, of the life-giving cross of Christ, and may we always rejoice in the Light of Christ that shines in hearts.
