We began by praising God in people's homes. Soon we grew to have a minister who was paid in part by produce grown by families to free him of trouble as much as possible. In the early years, women were not allowed to offer public prayer but were an integral part of the church in many ways. Within the past 5 years, we have had 2 women ministers with several other substitute women ministers serving us. We have been through many difficult times: morality, discrimination, wars, and slavery, as just a few examples in those 200 years. Through it all, we have persevered, survived, and thrived. Let us always look back and celebrate our past, but also be ever mindful of embracing our future so generations ahead of us can continue to carry on the spirit of Christ and spread God's love in the world as our ancestors before us have done. God is still speaking.
