INTERFAITH FIELD TRIP REFLECTIONS

On September 6, sixteen members and friends of Strongsville UCC met at the Islamic Center of Cleveland for a time of questions and answers with our Muslim brothers and sisters. The emphasis of the evening, over and over again, was on those things we all have in common, rather than on the things that separate us. Here are a few of the things we learned:

- The three major world religions, Judaism, Christianity and Islam, are all Abrahamic faiths, meaning we are all descendants of Father Abraham. (If you would like to read the story of Abram/ Abraham and his descendants, it all begins in Genesis 12.)
- While Jews and Christians claim Isaac as our religious patriarch, Muslims are of the line of Ishmael.
- Like us, Muslims worship Almighty God; their word for God is Allah.
- The Quran suggests we are all neighbors, falling into three groups: *close* neighbors, who are in our lives on a daily basis; *distant* neighbors, who are family and friends perhaps separated by distance; and *circumstantial* neighbors, who are by our side when we need support.

The Islamic Center of Cleveland believes we need to work together to "dispel the bogeymen" of wrong belief that sow hatred and distrust. To that end, they partner with churches to host a *Teatime for Peace*. These gatherings allow further exploration of what makes us *all* human and beloved of God.

The Sunday School students voted and the money from September's collection will go to the victims of Hurricane Florence through UCC Disaster Relief. Start saving that change for our next Penny Sunday collection on October 28. Money from the October 28 Penny Sunday will go to Together We Rise.

Together We Rise helps children in several ways including three main programs used to support children in foster care: Sweet Cases, Build A Bike, and the Family Fellowship Scholarship Program. Sweet Cases is their largest program, helping to replace trash bags with blue duffel bags to make the foster care transitions a little bit easier for children. When foster youth age out of the system, Together We Rise helps provide them bikes, so they're able to get to their jobs and school classes. For former foster youth, Together We Rise supports them with a scholarship program. Their Family Fellowship is the largest scholarship program in the nation that benefits youth who have aged out of the system.

MISSION OUTREACH



Your **Mission Outreach** Committee, as part of this year's Veterans Day project, will be putting together **Comfort Kits** for distribution to local veterans in need during the month of November.

In conjunction with the Veterans Service Commission, Wade Park VA and the Berea Food Pantry, we have committed to assembling a total of **100 Comfort Kits** designed to meet the needs of local veterans. **The cost per kit is \$10**, based on a sample kit containing items purchased at **The Dollar Tree** in Berea (near Giant Eagle at Bridge & Prospect).

Each kit, assembled in a drawstring bag, will contain:

- Two pairs of white socks
- 7 oz. Toothpaste
- Toothbrush
- 6 oz. Shaving cream
- Razor
- 15 oz. Body Wash/ Shampoo
- Bath sponge

Items for the Comfort Kits will be collected throughout October. The Kits will then be dedicated during worship on October 28, and delivered in the weeks following. You may place purchased items in the collection box in Pilgrim Hall throughout October. **If you prefer to sponsor a veteran for \$10**, you may do so on Sunday mornings at the Mission Outreach Table. With your donation, you may include a favorite Bible verse, a thank you, a positive affirmation or similar messages of caring written on an index card we will provide. Envelopes will be provided for both notes and donations.
