


STRATEGIC PLANNING

UPDATE FROM LEEK PIPE ORGAN COMPANY

James Leek has submitted the progress report (printed below) to the ORC detailing everything they have accomplished to date on the Choir Restoration and Bellows Installation. James and his staff continue to remain



in close contact with Jim Heinrich and members of the ORC as the work continues. As indicated in his update, they are on track to have the entire choir restoration completed by the end of September, at which time we will once again be able to use the entire organ during our worship service. Thanks to all our church members for their continued support of this restoration.

The bellows installation is completed per contract, and the bellows are operational. As to the Choir Division Restoration, per the contract, we have re-leathered all the pouch boards for the Choir Main Chest in the workshop and the chests have been cleaned. All chest magnets have been replaced with new units and the magnet boards have new gasket leather installed. New cable has been installed to all of these chests. The expression machine has been rebuilt. New Direct Valve electric magnets for the Cornopean and the Gedeckt offset chests have been installed. The stop action for the choir main chest is controlled by the solid state switching and this is functional. We are currently working on rebuilding the Tremolo and two offset chests at the shop. Next week we will be pulling out the wooden pipes that need the stoppers repacked and taking them to the shop for work. We have begun testing the components that have been reinstalled so far and this will continue through the end of the month. Jim Heinrich and myself had mutually agreed on the completion of the work at the end of the September because of the additional work that was contracted.

We are currently on track for meeting the end of September deadline for completion of the Choir Division Restoration.
